NICE RESPONSE TO COVID-19

NICE is currently open for all services

We are constantly monitoring government advice, including local and national guidelines and will respond as necessary. In order to ensure a safe environment for our families we have introduced the following measures:

- All staff working directly with children and adults will be wearing appropriate PPE
- Staff observe 2m distance when moving around the building
- Reception areas have limited timed entry to reduce footfall
- NICE is closed to all but essential visitors
- Services have allocated times for entry and exit
- Sanitising stations are available throughout the buildings
- Children's and adults services are retained within their own separate building
- Staff are maintaining departmental bubbles
- Adult group sizes have been reduced to maintain social distancing between participants; Children's services maintain social distancing between pupils
- We have retained a range of remote services for our adults to ensure that we can reach everyone who needs our support.
- Increased cleaning regime at regular intervals during the day
- Increased awareness of hand washing and cleanliness

As a service and training based charity we are of course facing an unprecedented situation and one which has and still requires us to respond flexibly and rapidly. Each department will have their own detailed procedures which are made available to the families/students attending. We are constantly monitoring our procedures to ensure that everyone who comes to NICE is as safe as possible.
